FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

In the 2016-17 school year, Dayton Grade School students in grades 3 through 5 participated in the Smarter Balanced Assessment. Students prepared for this rigorous assessment by participating in a variety of activities. Each grade level focused on writing, using our Benchmark Literacy curriculum, to assist our students to clearly communicate their reasoning on both the Language Arts and Math portions of the assessment. Our students also worked hard in the area of math and made great gains.

Dayton Grade School has been intensely focused on improving student achievement. While the state suspended the overall rating of schools, our results show Dayton students are making excellent growth in both Language Arts and Math. The highest score a school can receive in any area is a level 5 and Dayton Grade School received a score of level 4 in both Academic Growth and Subgroup Growth and a level 3 in Academic Achievement. These results are very encouraging and highlight the hard work of both staff and students. Efforts to align curriculum, increase student engagement, and track student

achievement in both reading and math are leading to success for Dayton students.

Over the last few years, Dayton Grade School has adopted rigorous new curriculum in both Math and Language Arts. Also, teachers work in grade level teams that meet weekly to make data-based instructional decisions to meet each student's needs. We are also continuing our focus on providing evidence-based interventions for students who are functioning below grade level academically.

Each of us plays a role in our students' successes. Thank you for your commitment to our team. We look forward to seeing you at Open House, Student Conferences, Family Nights and other events throughout the school year.

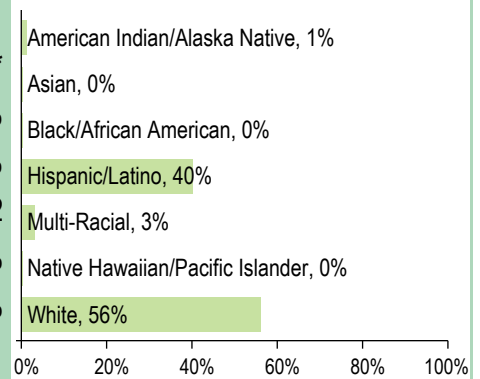
